#### **School Funding**

We are sure that many of you will be fully aware from the news that all schools are facing enormous cost pressures. The National Audit Office estimates that schools' budgets will shrink in real terms by £3 billion by 2019/20.

The money provided to run our schools has been consistent for the past few years. Whilst at first glance this may seem good, we need to remember that there has been a huge increase in the costs of National Insurance and Pension contributions, this has impacted heavily on budgets. The new funding coming into schools is, in the main, money to set up grammar schools and free schools. The recent headlines have been caused by a proposed new funding formula for schools, designed to create a fairer allocation. However, with increasing costs placed onto all schools the new formula will not bring the benefits that we had hoped to see.

We are of course working hard on looking for savings through creative management of the budget. We will continue to keep you informed and of course our priority is to maintain, and develop further, the quality of education that your children deserve.
