Parent Information

Children are encouraged to come in to the classroom from 8.45am and settle with their morning work ready for learning. Please support your child to come in to the classroom with increasing independence. The morning is a busy time in the classroom. It is not possible for teachers to meet with individual parents at length, as they need to be available to the children. You are very welcome to arrange a meeting with your child's class teacher after school to discuss any queries or concerns you may have.

The Preschool requests, in the interest of children's safety, that parents who do not have children in the preschool, do not walk through their setting to exit the building. All school parents should exit the building via the playground gate.

Measles, chicken pox and shingles

Please may we remind you of an important matter.

One of our pupils is receiving medical treatment for cancer which puts them at risk if they are exposed to measles, chicken pox or shingles.

Please let us know immediately if your child is suspected of having measles.

Our pupil is also at risk from chicken pox and would need to be given an injection within three days of contact. If your child is suspected of having chicken pox, you should let us know.


It is also important that you let us know if there is shingles in your household. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

Primary Writing Project

This week sees our launch of the
Primary Writing Project, as we send a
team of staff out to begin the process.
Over the next two years we will be

working hard to improve standards in



children's writing across the school. We are joining with twelve other CAST primary schools across the Diocese to take part in "The Primary Writing Project", working together with them to develop teaching and learning for writing.

The aim of the Primary Writing Project is to motivate children and teachers as writers, deepening understanding about writing and refining skills so that children make good progress and standards are raised. The project is based on clusters of schools, with a similar interest in improving writing, working collaboratively over time. Each school has a 'project team' that meets regularly, developing and leading the project in school. Every teacher and teaching assistant will also have whole day training sessions. We look forward to sharing the outcomes with you.

School Council

Children in Y1 upwards have the chance to be a member of the School Council. To stand for election pupils need to write a manifesto that:



- Introduces themselves
- Explains why they want to be a School Council Representative
- Explains why they would be a good choice for their class

Parents are welcome to help their younger children to write their manifesto, but it is important that the child wants to be a School Council Representative.

Hannaford by Friday 22nd September. Elections
will be held in classes on Thursday 28th
September. The new School Council will be
announced at Prayer and Praise on Friday 29th
