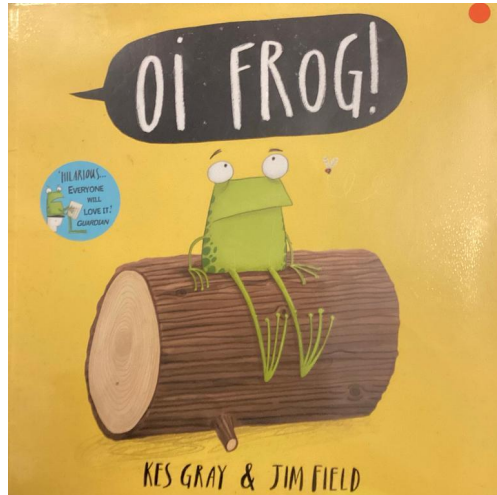

This month has been so jam packed it has had to go on two pages!

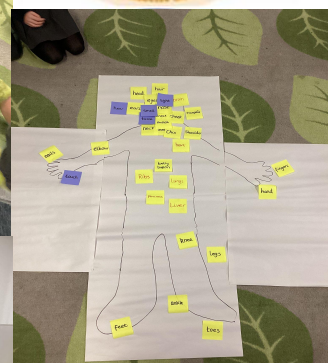
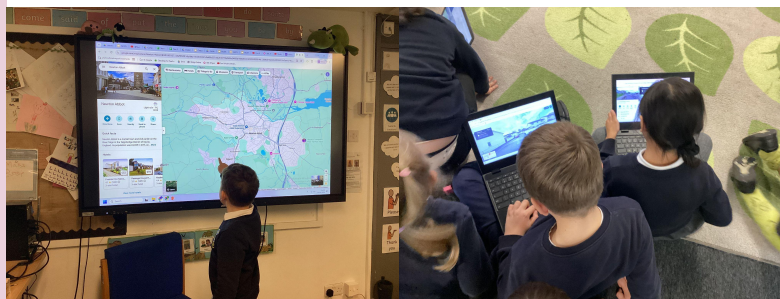
