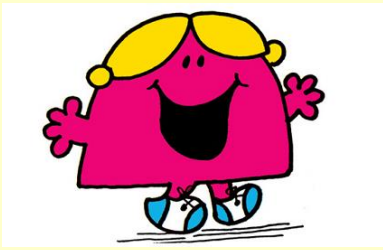

- Everyone takes part

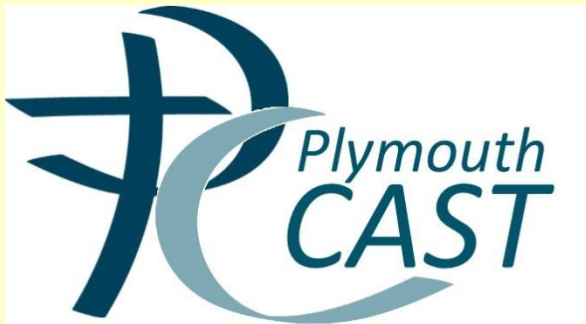

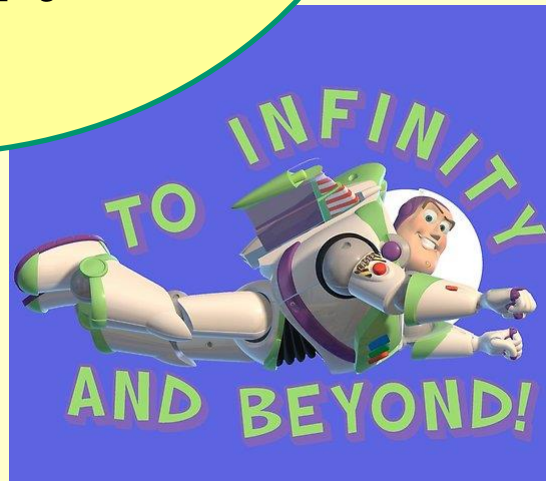
