Covid update

The guidance has now changed and regular testing is a thing of the past.

Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities, and they no longer have a high temperature.

Children and young people, who are unwell and have a high temperature, should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.

Covid update

Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious.

For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.

This suggests that we treat covid like any other illness. If your child is poorly, instead of testing them, keep them at home until they are no longer poorly.
