

As you may well be aware, we have continued to be impacted by Covid. With this in mind we, along with all Plymouth CAST schools, have made the decision to continue with the current precautions in school. To this end staff will continue to wear masks in communal areas until the February half-term.

We're excited to be taking part a UK competition to help raise the profile of NSPCC Number Day. Number Day is a fun, nationwide, maths-themed fundraising event that helps raise money to support the NSPCC. Every pound you raise will add up to help keep children safe.

As part of our commitment to make maths exciting and high profile in our school, we are taking part in a friendly competition involving schools in the UK for NSPCC Number Day on Friday the 4th February. It's all done online via play.ttrockstars.com.

For every correct answer to a multiplication or division question, your child will earn their class a point. The Times Tables Rock Stars platform will calculate the class average (the number of correct answers per pupil in the class who play during the competition hours, subject to a daily 60-minute limit (see below)). Winning classes in the school and in the competition as a whole will be the ones with the highest average.

All game modes (Gig, Garage, Studio, etc.) will count but only from games played <u>between</u> 7:30AM BST and 7:30PM BST on Friday 4th.

To support player wellbeing, there is a daily time limit of 60 minutes per player. In other words, each player can earn competition points for up to 60 minutes between 7.30am and 7.30pm on Friday 4th. Once the player goes beyond 60 minutes of play on that day, they will still earn coins but will no longer earn points towards the competition.







Children are invited to wear their scarf to school on Friday 11th.




T-shirt Competition for World Book Day
