NSPCC Speak out. Stay safe. programme

This week all children have participated in the NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe programme. It aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse in a child friendly way. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a trusted adult or Childline. By the end of the programme, we're convinced children will feel empowered – knowing how they can speak out and stay safe.

Kindness starts at home, so we are encouraged to think about the different messages we give to our children about kindness in our words and our actions. On 20th October, South West Directors of Public Health recommended that due to the rise in cases in the local area, schools put in place a precautionary and sensible set of measures for the two weeks after half term. This has included a stopping whole school assemblies and gatherings.

This position was reviewed on 10th November, and a continuation of precautionary measures has been recommended until any further guidance is received.

In school, we continue with our regular touchpoint cleaning and good ventilation.

Please do not send your child to school if they are displaying Covid symptoms.

PRIMARY SCHOOL ADMISSIONS

If your child was born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018 they will be due to start at primary school from September 2022.

You will be able to apply for a primary school place between 15 November 2021 and 15 January 2022.

You will be able to apply online using the Citizen's Portal. If you do this the local authority will notify you of the outcome of your application by email on 19 April 2022. This is the most preferable way to make an application.
