

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We have been in touch with Devon County Council with regards to the issues of traffic outside the school and Francis being off sick.

This is the response we received:-

*Thank you for letting us know about the situation. I'm sorry to hear about the problems.*

*Unfortunately we don't have cover for most Patrols in Devon and recruitment for any School Crossing Patrol is difficult, however if you know of anyone in the school community, maybe a parent, TA or MTA for example who would like to volunteer to be a Crossing Patrol we could then go through our normal recruitment, checking and training process.*

*Hopefully Mr Tadd-Clarke should be returning to work in early April but in the meantime it may be worth reminding parents that they remain responsible at all times for the safety of their children on their whole journey to and from school, regardless of whether a formal crossing or a Patrol is provided and that the crossing point is unmanned at present.*



**Could we please ask all Parents/Carers to park responsibly outside the school and not on double yellow lines and zig zags, especially above the school gates and on the junction of Greenaway Road.**

Please also be aware of careless drivers when crossing the road with your children.

We have been in touch with Francis and you will be pleased to hear that his operation was successful and he has started physio and is recovering well. We look forward to seeing him back soon.
