The total raised, to date, from the appeal is nearly  $\pounds17,000$ (2016: 24K). Although this total is well down on last ear's collection, thanks to your generosity, support and oravers we continue to build God's kinadom - a community of love. Thank you.

The following comments from two recent benefactors illustrates the variety of the applications we receive; how challenging the applicants' situations can be and the difference a grant can make to someone's life.



I would like to take this opportunity to say a huge thank you all for your help and support during a very difficult time for me and my girls.....The grant has enabled us to have our own home and space and start to heal from the tough time we've had...I feel auite embarrassed and I am not in the habit of asking for help but found myself in a situation where I really didn't know which way to turn. You have helped us so much and for that I am eternally arateful.



Thank you so much, this has made such a difference for me and my family. I have saved to buy furniture for m family, I would have had to leave everything and start again if I was not able to

## The first was a grant that went to a professional mum who found herself in a desperate situation following a relationship crisis and the second

grant paid for furniture storage whilst a family awaited a decision on their asylum status. Without this storage the family would have lost all the possessions (for a second time) that they had slowly collected second hand since their arrival in the country.

# PATCHWORK PARENTING PROGRAMME

## Review 2017

This year we have provided eleven parenting courses in the Diocese, 72% within individual schools, 28% in neutral venues, including church halls. We have been pleased to visit new schools while we are returning more regularly to other schools which have built our parenting programmes into the annual plan. 36% of our courses have taken place in Catholic schools, 10% in Church of England schools and 54% within the wider community.

The courses have included three early years, six primary and two teenage courses and have taken place in Newton Abbot, Plymouth, Plympton, Saltash, Barnstaple, Launceston, Bodmin and Camborne.

It has been a privilege to work with 66 parents, including six parents with English as an additional language, sharing their concerns, ideas and successes relating to their individual children- 35 pre-school children, 79 primary children and 45 secondary children in all. Throughout the seven or eight weekly sessions we discuss a range of issues from self-esteem and emotions to behaviour strategies and safety concerns.

## Feedback

When asked if they would recommend the Patchwork Parenting sessions to othe parents and carers 100% of parents said they would recommend them, saying:

'It helps with speaking out' 'Positive ways taught in the sessions on dealing with behaviour' 'Great to meet others and not feel alone' 'Very positive and non-judgemental'

'Yes, absolutely fabulous advice and sharing ideas'

#### The PATCHWORK PARENTING PROGRAMME

The Society offers practical and emotional support to parents and carers through the following parenting programmes:

#### Parenting through the Early Years

Seven weekly sessions offering effective parenting support to parents of toddlers, pre-schoolers or children in the first few years of primary school. It is simply written, jargon-free, with a common sense approach.

#### Parentina through the Primary Years

A thought provoking programme of eight sessions, for parents of children of all ages, although ideally it is aimed at parents with children at primary school.

#### Parenting through the Teenage Years

Seven sessions dealing with the more difficult situations often met in the teenaae vears. The course is suitable for those whose children are approaching the teenage years as well as those with teenage children already.

The programmes provide parents and carers with the opportunity to support each other and, with the help of a trained facilitator, build on their own strengths to understand their children better and confirm their parenting skills.
