

Contact Tracing during the half term break

Where a pupil tests positive for coronavirus having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, the school need not be contacted. Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

If there is a positive COVID case, parents will receive a Dojo message from school advising them to self isolate and what the period of self isolation should be.
